DESCRIPTION

Many Dartmouth Health professionals and patients we serve are experiencing significant Intimate Partner Violence (IPV) and don't know what resources are available to them. Come learn about crisis center advocacy that provides ongoing support to survivors of domestic and sexual violence, trafficking, and stalking. WISE is the crisis center serving DH Lebanon and 23 communities across the Upper Valley, including 24/hour accompaniment to Dartmouth Hitchcock Medical Center and area affiliates. Learn about WISE (and other crisis center locations), hospital partnerships, and options/resources for survivors.
