Course Description

The time is now, so get PrEP'd. The United States government's Ending the HIV Epidemic initiative includes the goal of increasing PrEP prescribing to at least 50% by 2025. In Partnership with the New England AIDS Education and Training Center, we present a 7-part series providing the information, resources, and tools necessary to empower clinicians to confidently prescribe PrEP to those at risk for HIV infection.
